#### Warm Homes: Solving England's Fuel Poverty Problem

BRE helps the government measure progress on tackling fuel poverty by providing fuel poverty statistics for the Department for Energy and Net Zero, collected in the official English Housing Survey. SAP, the government's model of home energy performance originally developed by BRE, underpins the energy need component of the fuel poverty level calculation. #### BRE to Lead on Development of SAP as Industry Prepares for Future Homes Standard

BRE has been awarded contracts by the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ) to develop both the Home Energy Model (HEM) product recognition system and the Standard Assessment Procedure (SAP). Both these government methodologies will underpin the Future Homes Standard (FHS) when it comes into force this year and the ongoing development of Energy Performance Certificates (EPCs). Read more.
